2025 Policy Priorities


- Pass Dietetic Compact Legislation in Iowa
- Expand Access to Dietitian-provided Services
- Ensure Adequate Food and Equitable Healthcare Access

Dietitian Licensure Compact

- ↑ Access to/continuity of nutrition care
- ↑ Telehealth opportunities
- ↑ Income/job opportunities for RDNs
- ↑ Mobility (e.g., active duty military)
- ↓ Administrative burden

Passed in 4 states (Ohio, Nebraska, Tennessee, Alabama)


Legislation pending in 11 states

Key Legislative Dates

First Day of Session: January 13th Funnel Week I: March 7th - bills must make it through a Senate or House committee to survive

Funnel Week II: April 4th- bills must pass through both a Senate and House committee to survive

110th Day of Session: May 2nd



Refresher: Bill Process

- A bill is introduced by a legislator in the House or Senate.
- The bill is assigned to a committee for study and recommendations.
- If approved by the committee, the bill is debated and voted on by the full chamber.

If passed:


- The bill moves to the other chamber, where it undergoes a similar process.
- Differences between House and Senate versions are reconciled.

Refresher: Bill Process (cont.)

Final steps:

- The reconciled bill is sent to the Governor for approval or veto.
- If signed or if a veto is overridden, the bill becomes law.

Bills Monitoring

Double Up Food Bucks: <u>SSB 2012</u>, passed Senate subcommittee (Health and Human Services)

Eating Disorder Insurance Coverage: <u>HF 58</u>, introduced, referred to Commerce

Grocer Reinvestment Fund and Fruit and Vegetable Processing Grant Program: HF 59, passed House subcommittee (Economic Growth and Technology)

Rulemaking

ARC 8799C - Continuing education for dietitians, 922.2(4) Public comment: February 11th

"Licensees who complete continuing education hours in excess of the requirements for renewal may apply up to 50 percent of the required hours to the following renewal period. Licensees may apply a maximum of 15 hours from the previous renewal period."
